

**Up to \$1,000 Reward Offered for Information
Leading to Arrest of Robbery Suspect**

Lake Geneva , WI – February 4, 2010 – The Lake Geneva Police Department and Walworth County Crime Stoppers are offering a cash reward of up to \$1,000 for information leading to the arrest of the suspect(s) believed to be responsible for a pharmacy robbery that occurred at McCullough’s Drug Store located at 269 Broad Street in Lake Geneva.

The cash reward is donated by pharmaceutical company Purdue Pharma L.P., which operates RxPATROL[®], a collaborative effort between industry, pharmacists and law enforcement to collect, collate, analyze and disseminate information on pharmacy theft. Robbery Details for Public Announcement:

The Lake Geneva Police Department is investigating a pharmacy robbery that occurred at McCullough’s Drug Store, located at 269 Broad Street in Lake Geneva. *Walworth County Crime Stoppers* and law enforcement officials are asking for the public’s assistance by offering a reward of up to \$1,000, donated by Purdue Pharma L.P., for any information that will help solve this crime.

- **Date/Time:** December 7, 2009, 4:00 PM
- **Location:** McCullough’s Drug Store, 269 Broad Street, Lake Geneva, WI
- **Description of Events:** A suspect entered the store, displayed a black semi-automatic handgun and demanded prescription medicines. The suspect fled after he was given an undetermined amount of medication.
- **Suspect Description:** The suspect is described as a white male, approximately 6’ tall, weighing 200 pounds. He wore a black ski mask, black hooded sweatshirt and blue jeans.
